 - NCFAR and Riley Foundation hosted summit on future of agriculture research and delivery
 - Attended by many commodity and industry groups and Land-grant University representatives
 - Discussed future needs for agriculture and food science research and delivery
 - Report due out in August
 - Planning committee is also setting up meetings with USDA leadership this fall to discuss follow up steps
- 4. Southern Mini Land-grant Meeting Update Eric Young
 - Planning is going well, topics for joint sessions on Wednesday are settled and currently working on confirming presenters/panelists
 - General schedule handout
 - <u>Draft joint sessions outline handout</u>
- 5. S-AHS Secretary Nominee Selection Tom Coon
 - Robert Taylor (Florida A&M Univ) was nominated and nominations closed
 - Election for Secretary will occur during the winter meeting and officers will rotate after that meeting

- 6. Budget realignment All
 - Mark Hussey's 2/14/18 charge letter to task force
 - Ernie Minton's 7/5/18 recommendations letter
 - Realignment draft FAQ's handout
 - Task Force assigned with recommending combination of budget lines, provided that the combinations are consistent with the following principles
 - o Protect individual program funding levels
 - Makes sense to group lines together
 - Maintains program integrity
 - Acceptable to stakeholders and appropriators
 - Draft line consolidation has been reviewed by COPs and AHS Executive
 - Next step is to share with sections during their meetings in October and November
 - After the Sections are comfortable with changes being proposed, the appropriate people will talk with various stakeholders for those lines being combined to get their input and buy-in
- 7. Moving Expenses as a Taxable Benefit All
 - Mark Cochran asked how other colleges were handling moving expense reimbursements for new hires now that they are considered a taxable benefit
 - Has moving company invoice the college directly, although it was pointed out that technically it's still a taxable benefit (OK State)
 - Add the value of the taxes to the reimbursement, which also increases the taxes, but insignificantly (Univ TN & VA Tech)
 - Gives the new hire a lump sum signing bonus that can be used for anything, which is also a taxable benefit, but normally is worth more than moving expenses and gives the flexibility on how to use it (TAMU)
- 8. Breakthroughs 2030 All
 - Breakthroughs 2030 Summary
 - Report was limited on anything outside of production agriculture
 - Not much mention of environmental impacts or food and health relationships
 - NASEM commission self-limited the study's scope to production agriculture to make the report manageable in breath

 - Monday, February 4, 2019, 11:00 3:00, in Birmingham, AL, during the Southern Association of Agricultural Scientists conference
 - Next year's Southern AHS/CARET summer meeting will be held during the Southern Mini Land-grant meeting in Ft. Lauderdale, FL, on March 18 – 21, 2019
