Strategic Realignment

The anticipated outcome of successfully executing this task is a growth in APLU priority lines via a legislative vehicle that is more receptive to BAA and stakeholder advocacy efforts.


Goal

Timeline

- Identify approach, sketch advocacy plan February
- BAC discusses approach and advocacy sketch-March
- BAC sends recommendation to PBD with final advocacy plan March
- Put advocacy plan into action: Engage NIFA/Administration, champions, & stakeholders.

Capacity Building

The BAA BAC can determine a growth plan for capacity funding lines that is anchored in a clear justification of need.

- Identify an aspirational goal that drives a request as well as the needs that the request will meet.
- Engage key advocates in the development of that growth trajectory.

The BAC work within the BAA structure* to develop a communication plan informed by advice from communicators, advocates, and decisionmakers.

- Publish an annual "Points of Pride" publication about the Cooperative Extension System, the State Agricultural Experiment Stations, the 1890s R&E, and the 1994s R&E.
- Engage a think tank in a study that describes the scientific, economic, and food/agricultural impact areas and economic impact statements.

Coordination with key groups in developing an annual capacity building, engagement and advocacy calendar.

- Develop a timeline for appropriations request decisions, justification data, capacity building
 opportunities, and engagement (w/ APLU BAA, coalitions/key stakeholders, Congress, and the
 Administration).
- Build a NIFA Coalition that supports key NIFA funding lines and engages key stakeholders.

APLU Board on Agriculture Assembly has joined the **Food and Agriculture Climate Alliance (FACA)** consisting of organizations representing farmers, ranchers, forest owners, the food sector, state governments and environmental advocates that are working together to define and promote shared climate policy priorities. A set of common policy recommendations has been developed for federal lawmakers in six areas: soil health, livestock and dairy, forests and wood products, energy, research, and food loss and waste. These recommendations share an overarching goal to do no harm.
